COMMON

- MILD BURNING OR BLEEDING ON PASSING URINE FOR SHORT PERIOD AFTER OPERATION
- TEMPORARY INSERTION OF A CATHETER
- USE OF XRAY IMAGING TO TAKE PICTURES OF URINARY TRACT

OCCASIONAL

- INFECTION OF BLADDER REQUIRING ANTIBIOTICS
- OCCASIONALLY WE CAN NOT PASS THE TUBE INTO THE URETER REQUIRING ALTERNATIVE TREATMENT
- TEMPORARY INSERTION OF A SOFT PLASTIC TUBE PLACED BETWEEN THE KIDNEY AND THE BLADDER IF NECESSARY WITH THE NEED FOR SUBSEQUENT LOCAL ANAESTHETIC REMOVAL
- PERMISSION FOR TELESCOPIC REMOVAL/ BIOPSY OF BLADDER ABNORMALITY/STONE IF FOUND

RARE

- DELAYED BLEEDING REQUIRING REMOVAL OF CLOTS OR FURTHER SURGERY
- INJURY TO URETHRA CAUSING DELAYED SCAR FORMATION

ALTERNATIVE THERAPY: OTHER FORMS OF X-RAY, CT SCAN OR ULTRASOUND
